The Most Holy Body and Blood Of Christ

2nd June 2024 - Year B

Dear Parishioners,

It's here! Our Parish's Corpus Christi Street Procession occurs today. I'm excited that our Parish, which has the only church building dedicated to The Most Holy and Body of Christ (Corpus Christi), has taken responsibility to celebrate its patronal feast day with a Street Procession. Sure, the Archdiocese is also holding a Street Procession, originating from and returning too the St Stephen's Cathedral, and our local Procession is not intended to diminish the Archdiocese's Procession which commences a few hours after our own (i.e. it starts at 2:00pm). What both Processions have in common is that they both serve to publicly witness our Faith in Jesus Christ, as our Lord and Saviour, to the broader community. It is a little like what Jesus says during his Sermon on the Mount, that 'no one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others...' (Mt 5:15-16a). The Processions afford us the opportunity to let the light of our faith to shine before others. How people respond after seeing the light of our faith is in the hands of the Holy Spirit.

Our Procession will stride off at 11:00am. Look for the notices that have been posted on the Corpus Christi church doors and the glazed front of the Parish Centre for information on where the groups participating in the Procession are to form-up. Eva Cusack and Anna Gomes have been assigned the duty of forming-up the Procession after the conclusion of our 9:30am Sunday Mass.

For those Parishioners who are unable to march in the Procession itself, you are welcome to sit comfortably on the Parish Centre's Buckland Road patio and watch the Procession head out and return before joining the marchers in the other liturgical celebrations to follow in the church.

There has been one slight change requested by the Queensland Police Service to the route that we have advertised and it is this: when the procession reaches Sandgate Road in the Nundah Village precinct, we have been asked to use the footpath rather than the paved roadway. We are complying with their request. I pray that there will be a good turnout of Parishioners, Parish Primary School staff and students, members of our different Parish Ministries/Groups, and finally, people from our neighbouring Brisbane North Deanery Parishes.

It is timely to remind all participants in our Street Procession that the Corpus Christi Feast Day celebrations continue beyond the Procession itself with Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament (until 1:00pm), and Benediction (at 1:00pm). I will also hearing people's Confessions for a 45-minute period during the Adoration phase.

The Procession, Adoration and Benediction formally concludes our Parish's 2024 Feastival season. After the event, the Parish will review our inaugural local Procession et cetera, so that we can improve our planning and execution of next year's Procession.
