Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

14th July 2024 - Year B

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend's Sunday Masses will include the formal enrolment of our young children in the second and final Sacramental Program for 2024, which is for the First Confession and First Holy Communion. A prerequisite for the children receiving these Sacraments is that they have already received a Christian Baptism and have been Confirmed. On completion of these two Sacraments in which they are being enrolled, they will have completed their Sacraments of Initiation, and in the eyes of the Church, the children will have equality with all others, young or old, who have been fully initiated and enjoy the same rights and privileges. I look forward to helping them to achieve this goal.

Last Sunday, it was my hope that all four of our RCIA Catechumens would be enrolled in the Book of the Elect. Unfortunately, two were absent. And since the Rite of Election is an essential element in their journey in faith towards full reception into the Church community, the Rite of Election will need to be repeated today during our 9:30am Nundah Mass before these two, being Sakiko Hirata and Felix Bonomini, along with the other three Candidates, David Thompson, Jennifer van Iperen and Myles Payne, submit themselves to the first of three Scrutinies. The Scrutinies serve to strengthen them in their resolve to become members of the Church community and to centre their lives on Jesus Christ. It was originally planned that it would only be the First Scrutiny that would be administered by me this weekend, but because of the absence of two Catechumens, it is necessary that today, both elements, the Rite of Election and the First Scrutiny, will need to be combined. The result is that the Mass time for our 9:30am Nundah Mass assembly may run close to or slightly over the 60 minutes mark. I offer my sincere apologies in advance, if this causes an inconvenience to any who are in the assembly during this Mass.

There has been an unprecedented surge in the number of funerals occurring in our Parish. There were four in the past week and another three are scheduled for this week. It seems to be a little lopsided in that all seven funerals are occurring in the one church building, and that is the Holy Trinity Church, Banyo. Our Banyo Sacristan, Val Stafford, will be there to ensure the respectful and fluent management of these funeral services occurs. A reason for the popularity of our Holy Trinity Church is its close proximity to Nudgee Cemetery. As I write this Message (and I do so early Thursday morning), there still remains the possibility of even more funerals occurring within our Parish churches before this coming Friday. The purpose of my mentioning something that is so consequential to my pastoral ministry and rarely rates a mention elsewhere is to acknowledge my heartfelt thanks to Val for her dedication and the personal sacrifices that she makes in her ministry as our Holy Trinity Church Sacristan. Thank you, Val!

The third and final State of Origin Rugby League match occurs on Wednesday night. The series is evenly poised at 1-1. New South Wales utterly destroyed Queensland in the first half of the series second match in Melbourne, and they went on to win despite a resurgence by Queensland in the second half of that same match. This week, Queensland have the home ground advantage, but are still the underdogs with the betting agencies. I'm a parochial Queenslander, so I'll be cheering Queensland on to a hopeful victory and retention of the State of Origin Trophy for another series.

May the Lord again bless you and your endeavours throughout the week ahead.
