Dear Parishioners,

May I extend a warm welcome to Peter Kearney who visited our Parish yesterday for his Concert-Reflection, *Signs of Hope – People of Faith*. You will recall how the Parish has been promoting this pastoral event across the past two months. Peter shared with us songs and stories of people who have made a difference. If you are receiving our Parish Newsletter electronically as an email, then there is still time to attend this Concert which commences at 11:30am on Saturday, 20 July. The cost of entry is a Gold Coin for an adult, children will be admitted free. I look forward to seeing you there.

The Concert Program provides for two 45-minute sessions with a luncheon interval in between. I sincerely thank our Parish Care and Concern Group for catering the luncheon.

This week in our Archdiocese is Catholic Education Week. St Joseph's Primary School community, Nundah, will be celebrating Catholic Education Week with a liturgy which will coincide with Grandparent's Day on Friday 26th July. The day happens to coincide with the Memorial Feast of Saints Joachim and Anne, the parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the maternal grandparents of our Lord, Jesus Christ. St Pius V Primary School, Banyo will be holding a liturgy on Wednesday afternoon to mark Catholic Education Week and will celebrate Grandparent's on Friday afternoon at 2pm with a liturgy.

The Church also celebrates two other Feast Days this week, too. One on Monday, the other on Thursday. Monday is the Feast of St Mary Magdalene, and Thursday is the Feast of St James, Apostle.

In today's Gospel, we read of how his Twelve Apostles had returned from their training mission to go out and visit the surrounding towns and villages. They are excited and regale to Jesus how successful they were. Jesus listens to them patiently and then says that they must come away to some lonely place and rest for a while. So they cross over the lake, but the people anticipated where they would land and arrived there ahead of Jesus and his Apostles. Taking pity on the people, Jesus sets himself to teach at some length. And why did he do this? It was because to him, the people were like sheep without a shepherd. The following is a short reflective prayer about being sheep without a shepherd; you may find it beneficial.

Lord, look upon us and take pity on us, for at times we too are like sheep.

Save us from a blind following of the herd.

Help us to listen to your voice, to trust you and to follow you, even if it means leaving the crowd and walking a lonely path.

Lead us from fear to trust, from error to truth, from hate to love, from war to peace, from despair to hope, and from death to life. Amen.

May the week ahead be a blessed and fulfilling one for each of you.


SACRAMENTAL JOURNEY NEWS

NEXT SUNDAY 28TH JULY IS SEA SUNDAY Help us do a Stella job for seafarers.



Catholics around Australia are being asked to reflect on and support seafarers on Sea Sunday this year. "Without seafarers, we would not have most of the items we rely on for daily living," Stella Maris chairman Ray Collins said. They work tirelessly to bring into our ports products that sustain us and our economy.

Stella Maris is the official maritime welfare agency of the Catholic Church. In 1922, Pope Pius XI approved the first constitution of the movement, known as Apostleship of the Sea. Stella Maris now operates in over 300 ports across the world.

"People of the sea have always been important to the Church, from Christ gathering fishermen-disciples over 2000 years ago to chaplains and volunteers supporting merchant, passenger, fishing and other seafarers today," said Bishop Promoter of Stella Maris, Tim Norton.

From very humble beginnings, with the support of the clergy and the St Vincent de Paul Society, Stella Maris now has centres in every state of Australia and in the Northern Territory but there is still work to do, including providing support for seafarers in all Australian ports.

Stella Maris supports seafarers in spiritual, social and material ways, including prayer, helping them contact their families and advocating in Australia and internationally for safe and fair working conditions.

Examples of this can be seen daily from transporting seafarers from the ships to Stella Maris centres, and providing accommodation and meals, to caring for those who are sick or injured and in times involving the death of a seafarer.




