Dear Parishioners,

It would be virtually impossible for anyone to be non-conscious of the 2024 Paris Olympics. They fill our media – television, radio, newspapers, internet, and social media – with news of what is happening or has happened. We might generally classify this kind of news as 'good news stories', because they lift up our spirits.

But even the Olympics could not prevent the same media services from reporting during the week of the coldblooded killing of Israeli children by indiscriminate Hezbollah rockets launched from Lebanon, or Israel's retaliatory strikes and killing of a Hezbollah commander, Fuad Shukur in Beirut, and a Hamas political leader, Ismail Haniyeh, Tehran, Iran. War is never the answer, peace is. May we continue to pray for peace to prevail in the war-torn regions of Ukraine and the Middle East, until all conflict ceases.

This past week, I welcomed onto our Parish Staff, Jillian Piper. Jillian has been employed as an Administrative Assistant to our Parish Manager, Debra Visser. Jillian comes to us with strong recommendations and I look forward to collaborating with her well into the future.

Thursday, August 8, is the Solemnity Feast of the first Australian Saint, St Mary of the Cross, Co-Patroness of Australia and the Archdiocese of Brisbane. Coincidentally, the Archdiocese is convening its annual Convocation of Clergy – the word 'Convocation' is a formal assembly of clerics (Bishops, Priests and Deacons) but that is but one of seven applications of the word according to the *Collins English Dictionary* – on Wednesday and Thursday of this week, so, I'm unable to offer any more than one Mass for Parishioners on Thursday, and that will be the regular 6:30pm weekday Mass at Banyo. The Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart (RSJ's), founded by St Mary of the Cross and Fr Julian Tenison Woods, have a long association with our Parish and its schools, and I would have dearly loved to celebrate a second Mass in the Nundah church, but the Convocation prevents that from happening.

Another casualty of the Convocation is the necessary cancellation of the Banyo, Wednesday 9:00am Mass for this week only. My apologies to all who are inconvenienced by the cancellation of this Mass.

Last Sunday (the seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time), we read in the Gospel of Jesus feeding the five thousand with five barley loaves and two fish. He then departs with his disciples to the other side of the Sea of Galilee. Today's Gospel is basically a continuation of last Sunday's Gospel. The people who were fed the loaves and fish seek to follow Jesus so that they might be fed again by him. The people were concerned with satisfying their physical hunger, and Jesus emphasises to them, that the food that matters is the spiritual kind, the eternal kind. And to help all of us to understand this better, I offer a short related reflective piece called **A Day at a Time**.

A Day at a Time

God provided a mysterious food called *manna* for the Israelites during their time in the desert. However, they were told not to stockpile the manna, but to gather only what they needed for one day. Jesus told his disciples not to worry about tomorrow. He said, "When you pray to your heavenly Father, you are to say, 'Give us this day our daily bread.'" No matter how difficult life may be, for those who trust in God and who live a day at a time, the manna falls every day.

May the Lord bless and protect you throughout the week ahead.
