Dear Parishioners,

At all Masses throughout the Archdiocese this weekend, the **Annual Catholic Campaign** will be conducted. You will recall how, last Sunday, all Mass attendees were invited to collect and take home an *Annual Catholic Campaign Envelope* (basically one per family) and to return it this weekend. To facilitate the collection of any and all *Catholic Campaign Envelopes*, we will take-up a second collection immediately after the first collection (which is intended to assist with the pastoral works of the Parish) has been completed. It is best if you do ensure that your *Catholic Campaign Envelopes* are fully sealed before you place them in a collection basket.

Today, during Mass, in lieu of my homily, we will either watch a video of the Archbishop's **Annual Catholic Campaign** address to the Archdiocese (Banyo Masses) or I will read a transcript of his address during our Nundah Masses.

Thank you for your generous response to this Annual Campaign.

Next Sunday, the weekend of the 24th and 25th of August will be a big weekend in the life of our Parish. At all Masses other than the 9:30am Nundah Mass, the children in our Sacramental Program will make their First Holy Communion. But during our 9:30am Nundah Mass, our five RCIA Candidates will be welcomed into our Church community through their reception of the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and First Holy Communion, and they will emerge from that Mass as Neophytes (i.e. beginners), and their lifelong journey of living the Faith truly begins. For those children of families who would ordinarily attend the 9:30am Mass and who are preparing to make their First Holy Communion, their First Holy Communion will be delayed by a week until Sunday, 1 September (Father's Day). I would ask that you support the children making their First Holy Communion and our five RCIA Candidates in your daily prayers.

There will be a celebratory morning tea for the Neophytes who have just joined our Church and Parish community after next Sunday's 9:30am Mass in Nolan Hall. Monica Molloy has offered to supervise this function, and she has asked the Parish to request people who will be in attendance for this particular Mass to kindly bring along a plate of food suitable for a morning tea for sharing at next weekend's morning tea. I would hope that a good number of Parishioners might stay on after the Mass to personally celebrate and congratulate our five Neophytes. Thank you for your assistance with the catering.

During September, the Parish will be entering into a Parish community drive to enrol individuals and families in our new Parish registration system called 'Flocknote'. Flocknote is a database system which will replace our antiquated and now non-supported database known as PACS. Our Parish, along with the majority of Parishes within the Archdiocese will convert to Flocknote before the end of 2024. As I mentioned earlier, our Parish will commence this process next month. In the past few weekend Newsletters, you may have noticed a few promos concerning Flocknote. What the Parish is basically looking for from Parishioners is your assistance in starting the process. The first step is for households to go online using the QR Code provided and enter the basic information – full names of residents, the residential and contact particulars, and perhaps other information that I'm oblivious to at the moment. I understand that it is a simple process so please don't become overly concerned that it will be too complicated for you.

This week we have ordained and installed the new Bishop of Cairns, Joseph Caddy, who was Vicar General of Melbourne. It's a big leap to go from Southern Victoria to Far North Queensland, but Bishop Joe has the gifts and experience to make the leap without too much difficulty. He has long involvement in social welfare and for many years was a prison chaplain. So he has mud on the boots. He also has an easy way with people of all backgrounds, and that will stand him in good stead. But then on top of all the pressures he's facing as he settles into a new home and role, the helicopter crashes into the hotel just across the road from the cathedral where many of us were to stay. Panic descended on Cairns as they scrambled to find other accommodation for the guests. But somehow it all worked out. As I said to Joe, as a bishop you have to expect the unexpected.
