Dear Parishioners,

HAPPY FATHER'S DAY!!

I'll begin by wishing all fathers present at Mass or who may read my message a Happy Father's Day for 2024. I hope that your day will be a joy filled one, especially with the blessed attendance of your children and perhaps grandchildren and great-grandchildren to brighten up the occasion.

Last Sunday's First Holy Communions and the reception into the Church of five new adult members were sublime. I thought that our liturgical celebrations welcoming Sakiko, Felix, Myles, David and Jennifer into our Church and Parish family, and then the Morning Tea that followed, were excellent. I was particularly pleased with the attendance of Parishioners for both. As I publicly stated during the Sunday Masses of the previous weekend, First Holy Communions and the reception of new members into the Church via the RCIA Program, are worthy of strong support by all Parishioners, since they are, in reality, Parish communal celebrations. My thanks, again, to all who assisted the forty-nine First Holy Communicants and five RCIA Candidates in any shape, form or fashion, in their preparation and celebration for your contributions. I trust that our liturgies were and will remain memorable.

I have felt an enormous weight lift from my shoulders over the past three weeks or so when I finally decided and actioned on where I would go for my vacation which commences on Monday. I'm excited that my holiday destination is to be the beautiful Lord Howe Island. The island lies due east of Port Macquarie in New South Wales, – midway to New Zealand – and it truly possesses, in my humble opinion, Garden of Eden qualities about it. 'RESPECT AT WORK' BILL

The Queensland Government have released a bill that threatens our ability to say and teach what we believe.

The "Respect at Work" bill creates a ban on "hateful" speech that could include a wide range of religious teaching. It also empowers the Anti-Discrimination Commissioner to investigate churches and other faith groups to ensure compliance. Faith leaders have told the Government what is wrong with the bill, but have been ignored.

The most important thing you can do is to write to your local MP and tell them you are concerned about the bill.
