# Twenty Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time 13 October 2024 — Year B

Dear Parishioners,

It would be fair to say that anyone who attended one of last weekend's Parish Sunday Masses would be aware of my recent health issues. Perhaps not all of the specifics, but certainly that I had a fainting episode during last Saturday night's 6:00pm Vigil Mass. Again, I express my gratitude to the rapid respondents of all who came forward to my aid at that time and subsequently, and in particular, our Parish Manager, Debra Visser, who has been once again most helpful to me since Tuesday – coordinating replacement priests to cover this weekend's Masses and Baptisms, and chauffeuring me to St Vincent's Private Hospital, then back home afterwards, and then to the radiologist, shopping, etc. I would have been lost without her help and the help of other Parish staff. Thank you to you all! And thank you everyone for your prayers and well wishes.

As you know, I have just recently returned from a four-week vacation fully rested. However, two Sundays before I returned to my ministry, I had two dizzy spells again while celebrating Mass for the Lord Howe Island Catholic community. Now, I didn't think too much about that at the time, it was seemingly an isolated incident and I simply moved on with life. However, in the light of last Saturday night's fainting spell, and those two instances of dizziness that immediately preceded it, and then again on Wednesday of this past week, during the 9:00am Mass, when I felt a little more light-headedness, when that is all taken together, I have become quite concerned about my current health and wellbeing.

On Tuesday after the long weekend, I called my GP to book an urgent appointment to discuss Saturday night's events with him. Fortunately, I was able to see him at noon. He ordered more immediate blood tests and gave new referrals to a Cardiologist and a Haematologist, and I booked future appointments with both specialists that same day - the Cardiologist's appointment is in mid-November. I was directed by my GP to take things steadily in the meantime.

Fortunately for me because it dovetailed together so conveniently, I had a sleep disorder specialist appointment on Wednesday afternoon, so I took the opportunity to ask him if he would check my blood pressure because of that morning's light-headedness, and when I elaborated about my recent fainting and dizziness incidents, he gave me a detailed examination of my lungs, blood pressure, pulse, etc. in addition to my original purpose in visiting him. The upshot was that he suspected a blood clot on my lung and he directed me to immediately undergo a CT Scan of my lungs at St Vincent's Hospital. He also forbade me to drive until after I had been cleared by the Cardiologist whom I had referred to in the preceding paragraph.

I spoke further with this specialist on my return home on Wednesday night, when he followed up with me on the CT Scan results. The good news was that there was no blood clot on either lung. At the end of our lengthy conversation, he directed me to have a ultrasound scan of my carotid arteries. That scan is scheduled for later today (Friday)

I mention all this because what is happening to me right now has an immediate flow-on effect on you as Parishioners, and of course, the day-to-day pastoral operations of our Parish; it is not for any attention-seeking motives on my part. Rather, it is to keep you fully apprised of the situation.

As I write this on Friday morning, I am uncertain of what the outcome might be of that carotid artery ultrasound. So, I and our Parish staff have game played how best to respond to the ultrasound outcome. Together, we planned for the worst whilst hoping for the best. The worst being my immediate hospitalisation. So, replacement priests (Frs John Gillen and Rodel Enriquez) have been arranged for this weekend's Sunday Masses and Saturday confessions and Fr Robert Doohan from Geebung Parish substituting for my Saturday Baptisms, and I thank them sincerely for coming to the rescue. It would also follow that our Parish weekday Masses would, for this week at least and until further notice, be suspended.

The best scenario is that I receive the all-clear. If that should be the case, then I will be back on duty Monday to celebrate that morning's Mass, however, I will be instituting a temporary change to our regular weekday Mass venues and Mass times. The duration of these temporary weekday Mass arrangements will stand until I have been cleared by the Cardiologist – remember, I will see him mid-November. So from tomorrow (Monday 14 October) and assuming I have an all-clear result from the ultrasound, all weekday Masses will be celebrated only in the Corpus Christi Church, Nundah, and they will all start at 9:00am. I do emphasise that this is only an interim arrangement until after I have consulted with and cleared by my Cardiologist. I thank you for your understanding and cooperation if these temporary arrangements do come into play. One way or the other, you will know by Sunday which outcome is in play.

On an unrelated matter, Pope Francis on October 6, announced 21 new Cardinals and their Consistory will occur on December 8. Australia has one of the Cardinal-elects and he is Bishop Mykola Bychok of the Ukrainian Eparchy Saints Peter and Paul of Melbourne. We congratulate him and I ask you to remember Bishop Mykola in your prayers.
