Twenty Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time 20 October 2024 — Year B

Dear Parishioners,

I begin my Message with a brief update on my health. The old saying, 'No news is good news!' would seem to be applicable since at the time that I am writing this Message on Wednesday, I have had no feedback from any medicos. I have had an ultrasound of my lungs to see whether I had a blood clot or not, and since that would be considered serious and would warrant immediate attention, I can now assume that that was not the case. I have also had an ultrasound of my heart (a transthoracic echocardiogram) and worn an ambulatory ECG for 24 hours, but since the analysis of that won't reach my cardiologist until tomorrow, Thursday, at the earliest, I can only patiently wait. So, the interim 9:00am weekday Mass arrangements (all at Corpus Christi, Nundah), will continue to apply. Thank you once again for your prayers that I might return quickly to good health.

I must apologise for an oversight in not announcing in last weekend's Newsletter Message a forced change to the venue for the Saturday afternoon 4:00pm Parish Confessions. They are normally conducted in our Banyo Church, but again, due to my prohibition from driving, I shall be celebrating the 4:00pm Saturday Confessions at a slightly later time of 4:30pm in the Corpus Christi Church, Nundah, too. The 4:30pm time affords those Parishioners who do come to Confession the option of staying on for the 6:00pm Vigil Mass. The 4:00pm time is a purely arbitrary time anyone because it had to take into consideration the travel time for the Priest to close-up the Banyo Church and then to travel back to Nundah in adequate time for the Vigil Mass. Again, I must say that it is only a temporary arrangement and I'm sorry for any inconvenience that this and the other forced changes to the weekday Masses may cause Parishioners.

It is my intention to maintain our Parish diary in all other respects, and that includes the Parish's preliminary meeting with all who may be seeking to become Catholics. As most Parishioners would be aware, the Parish has already conducted two RCIA programs in 2024, and because there was an influx of further enquiries from interested adults, we are proposing to run a third program, with this one concluding during the 2025 Easter Vigil service (19 April). So, I would remind all who would like to become a Catholic or those who have family or friends who they know might also like to become a Catholic, that this general enquiry meeting will be held in the Parish Centre Meeting Room, on Saturday, 26 October, commencing at 10:00am. Any fully initiated Catholics who might like to assist me as a Catechist or as a Sponsor should also attend this meeting. I would also ask that any prospective RCIA Candidate (being people who reside within the Parish's parochial boundaries) to contact the Parish Office and obtain and complete a RCIA Registration form and to either bring the completed form with them on the Saturday of the meeting or to return it to the Parish Office before the meeting. 

Commiserations for Brisbane

POPE Francis has appointed Brisbane auxiliary Bishop Tim Norton as the third Bishop of Broome today.

Brisbane Archbishop Mark Coleridge said the "only surprise of Pope Francis' appointment of Bishop Tim Norton SVD as the new Bishop of Broome was its timing".

"It came earlier than many, myself included, expected," he said. "But it is good news for Broome, even if it will be a loss for Brisbane where Bishop Tim will be much missed.

"The Diocese of Broome has been very troubled in recent times, and Bishop Tim has the gifts and experience to take the process of healing and renewal begun by the Apostolic Administrator, Bishop Michael Morrissey, into a new phase.

"Bishop Tim is a missionary by vocation, and he will be able to draw upon the resources of the Divine Word Missionaries who are already a presence in the diocese.
