Something to Think About

When Jesus saw this, he became angry and said, "Let the children come to me! Don't try to stop them. People who are like these little children belong to the kingdom of God. I promise you that you cannot get into God's kingdom, unless you accept it the way a child does."

Group Activity


JESUS AND THE CHILDREN JIGSAW PUZZLE

You will need: a jigsaw puzzle activity sheet (photocopied in colour) for each child, blank paper to glue the puzzle back onto, scissors, glue, envelopes for puzzle pieces.

- Children cut along the red lines of the puzzle page. (An adult may need to do this step for very small children.)
- 2. Children put the picture back together.
- 3. There are two options for the next step:
 - a. Glue the puzzle back together on another sheet of paper.
 - b. Put the pieces into an envelope and take home/put away to do again later.

Cut the puzzle apart on the red lines, mix the pieces up, and put the picture back together.
