Second Sunday in Ordinary Time 19th January, 2025 — Year C

Dear Parishioners,

I awoke this morning (Thursday) to the breaking news that, after 467 days of conflict, a ceasefire agreement had been negotiated and agreed in Doha, Qatar, between Israel and Hamas over Gaza. It is a 3-phase agreement effective from 19 January 2025. Phase 1 is for a 42 day (6-week) period during which Hamas would release 33 captive hostages, and Israel would release hundreds of captive Palestinians. Phase 2 would entail the release of the balance of Hamas hostages and the repatriation of the bodies to Israel of all deceased hostages, while Israel's military forces would retire to the border between Israel and Gaza and permit humanitarian aid and supplies to re-enter Gaza. Phase 3 is the permanent ceasefire between the warring factions. The news of this negotiated ceasefire is heartening and welcome; it also is proof of the power of prayer and God's intervention through His Holy Spirit. Our hundreds of Hail Mary's praying for peace in the conflict areas of the world during our Parish Masses haven't been in vain. The other major conflicts to come to peaceful resolutions include the Ukraine - Russia Federation in Ukraine, the Israel - Hezbollah in Lebanon, the Christian - Muslim ones occurring between Sudan - South Sudan and also in Nigeria. Please continue to align yourself with the Pope's request that, we, the Church, pray for peace.

Friends, I have purposefully refrained from campaigning for additional people to serve as volunteers in our various Parish ministries until now, even though there has been an immediate and urgent need to recruit additional volunteers since mid-October 2024. I wanted to wait until Christmastide was over. The showcasing of the various ministries during Advent when representatives of the various ministries came forward and tied a bauble on the Christmas trees in both churches was just one-leg in the recruitment campaign. It was a softlysoftly approach. But the problem of fewer ministerial volunteers has been exacerbated with the retirements of some and the moving away of others to live elsewhere. One of the most dire Sunday Mass times affected is our 5:00pm Sunday Mass at Banyo; we are struggling to find ministers to either read or give Holy Communion out at the Mass. But all of our Sunday Masses could do with augmentation of our volunteer numbers. If you believe that you could assist with any of the following ministries, and you aren't already serving as a volunteer in any of them, I would be delighted to have you contact the Parish Office (3324 3870) and to offer your name. Some preparatory training may be required before commencing in some ministries, and our Parish Manager, Debra, could explain what this might entail when you call the Office. The ministries in need are:

- Sacristans (for weekday and Sunday Masses at both churches);
- Altar Servers (anyone who is a fully initiated Catholic is eligible);
- Extraordinary Ministers of the Word (Readers);
- Extraordinary Ministers of Communion (Holy Communion);
- Offertory Gift Processers; Pianists and/or Organists; Chorists/Singers;
- Parish Pastoral Councillors (there are three unfilled vacancies on this advisory Council dating back to mid-2024);
- Corpus Christi Procession Organisational Committee Members (to plan and coordinate the 2025 Street March through Nundah Village, 22 June 2025); and
- Organisers for the Corpus Christi Church 2026 Centennial Celebrations.

As you can see, there are a lot of areas in which the Parish needs help, so please contact the Parish Office if you are able to help us. Thank you!

I have one final important item to bring to your attention. It is the Parish's new database, Flocknote. The Parish began to promote and ask Parishioners back in September 2024 to register themselves and their households on Flocknote. We provided a **QR Code** in our Parish Newsletters for people to use to register themselves on Flocknote. The number of Parishioners who accessed the QR Code and registered on Flocknote is hard to assess, but I would think that it is less than 50% of all Parishioners. I therefore would renew our request for those Parishioners who have yet to register themselves and their households to do so soon, because the Parish will be switching over to it as being one of our primary communication tools to reach out and keep you informed. We will cease to distribute the E-Newsletter to people completely too and Flocknote will be the principal medium by which Parishioners will receive the weekly Parish Newsletter. Flocknote will provide the Parish with versatility and diversity. It can be tailored to reach out to people in particular Parish groups with news and updates (e.g. RCIA, Sacramental Programs, Care and Concern, Youth Group, Liturgy Groups, and so on). Your registration on Flocknote also serves as a quasi-census because it gives us an up-to-date count of our worshipping community.





I have heard it said that Flocknote's personal information (particularly one's personal financial records) can be hacked. I would like to disabuse these rumours. The Flocknote personal information that you provide in the registration process does not include any financial information at all, and since we do not ask for any financial information (e.g. Bank Account names and numbers or BSB numbers), it is impossible for hackers or anyone to gain this information through Flocknote. The information that is collected is solely that which you provide, so, in its own way, we will only ever know what it is that you tell us about yourself and your household members.


At this point, the Parish will be switching over completely to Flocknote prior to Easter 2025. It will be like the recent closure of the 3G Network in Australia; if you haven't made prior arrangements (i.e. Flocknote registration), then you will be cutoff from electronic communication with us and the other opportunities that Flocknote will provide, and you will have to rely solely on the printed version of the Parish Newsletter for your news. Please don't miss the boat, register now if you haven't already done so.

Australia Day (26 January) coincides with next Sunday's Masses. The Church in Australia has a liturgical option available: we can either celebrate the 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time or Australia Day using the special Collect, Prayer over the Offerings, Preface, Prayer after Communion and Solemn Blessing. I have decided for our Parish to use the latter.
