#### Third Sunday in Ordinary Time 26<sup>th</sup> January, 2025 — Year C *Australia Day*

Dear Parishioners,

Even though a 3-phase ceasefire agreement had been agreed between Israel and Hamas over Gaza, a cloud of doubt still continued through to 19 January, the effective commencement date of the 42 day ceasefire. The cloud of doubt was Hamas' failure to disclose the names of the hostages due to be released on the first day – January 19. Thankfully, the initial transfer of 3 hostages by Hamas, and some 70-odd Gazan prisoners by Israel went ahead. One would best describe the ceasefire agreement as being tenuous at best. Our continued prayers and the goodwill of both Hamas and Israel are needed for the ceasefire to hold.

Today is Australia Day. It should be a day of celebration for all Australians, but it is not necessarily so. Australia Day has been so politicised that for a few decades now, it no longer is a day for national unity. You might remember how Woolworths decided in 2024 to not retail any Australiana products that might be associated with Australia Day in its supermarkets; black bans by ordinary Australians of Woolworth stores followed and it had detrimental economic consequences for their business, and it was a decision that their chain subsequently rued. They have reversed their 2024 decision for 2025.

The politicisation occurred elsewhere too, right down to the Local Government level, with some Councils refusing to conduct naturalisation and citizenship rites for new Australians, which were always synonymous with Australia Day, for ideological reasons. Australian citizenship is something that should be highly prized and Australia Day, in my mind, is the ideal day for citizenship to be bestowed on people desirous of becoming naturalised Australians.

Today, I had the liturgical option to celebrate either the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time or Australia Day, I have gone with the latter in order to promote national pride. And to mark the occasion, we will sing as our Recessional Hymn at all Sunday Masses, the song, **God Bless Australia**, the lyrics of which can be found in this Newsletter edition. Happy Australia Day to us all!

Next Sunday, 2 February, is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. It is also referred to as Candlemas, the day in which the candles to be used in the Church for the next 12 months are blessed. Candlemas is an old tradition. People can also bring along candles that they will use in their homes in association with family prayers for a blessing too. Since it is only Corpus Christi Church that uses wax or paraffin candles on the Altar, the church's main blessing will be conducted during the 6:00pm Saturday Vigil Mass, however, if people were to bring their own candles along to other Sunday Masses, I am prepared to bless those candles too.

Our Schools resume their teaching roles from Wednesday of this week. There will be a large number of children of Prep age who will begin their scholastic journeys on Wednesday. With the return of students, I would ask two things of Parishioners: 1) remember the students in your prayers, and 2) drive safely around all schools and observe the 40 kilometre/hour speed limits that apply in school zones. Thank you.

Again, I pray, that the week ahead will be a blessed one for all of us. God bless!
