Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time 9th February, 2025 — Year C

Dear Parishioners,

A fortnight ago, I asked for help from Parishioners to serve the Parish in voluntary capacities in various ministries. I have had a response from three Parishioners, two have offered serve as Eucharistic Ministers, and one to serve as a member of the Corpus Christi Street Procession Organisation Committee. I thank these three people for their offer to help. But the sad reality is that a busy Parish such as ours, is in need of many volunteers across a variety of ministries for the Parish to run effectively and efficiently. In my opinion, the ideal situation is that anyone who comes forward as a volunteer to help in one of our liturgical ministries ought not be rostered on to serve in their chosen ministry or ministries than once a month. That leaves a degree of flexibility to be retained within people's lives so that they don't sacrifice other aspects of their personal and family lives out of a sense of obligation to the Parish family. Of course, there would be those who are quite comfortable in being rostered to serve the Parish in a liturgical ministry more regularly than on a monthly basis, and that would be their choice. However, the number of active Parish volunteers within liturgical ministries is now becoming alarmingly low. A case in point is the 5:00pm Sunday afternoon Mass in the Holy Trinity Church, Banyo.; for the past three weekends, we have been unable to roster anyone to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Communion, and so, I have been unable to offer Holy Communion under both species – the Precious Body and Blood of Christ – and I have only been able to offer the Precious Body of Christ. Of course, it must be stated that the reception of Holy Communion under one species only does not diminish the efficacy of Communion at all, but it is always desirable, where possible, to offer Holy Communion under both kinds.

A Parish that can boast a surfeit of liturgical ministry volunteers is a sure sign that the Parish is a thriving and vibrant one. And on this point, we are beginning to struggle. My aspirations for our Parish is that we, too, could boast once again, a surfeit of liturgical and other volunteers but I need the help of Parishioners for this to occur. So, a goal of mine for our Parish is that we might again achieve that status within the next two years — by the beginning of 2027 — and I need your help and cooperation to reach this goal or to make significant headway towards achieving the goal.

There is a natural attrition that inevitably occurs within the volunteer stocks of Parishes and our Parish is experiencing this phenomenon now. Circumstances like people moving house to live elsewhere, retirements from ministry due to age, ill health or frailty; or through resignations or a desire to take a back seat to others, are just some of the ways that our volunteer stocks can fall off.


