The Eighth Sunday in Ordinary time 2nd March, 2025 — Year C Project Compassion Sunday

Dear Parishioners,

I hope that you have been following the daily progress reports relating to the health condition of Pope Francis. He is still hospitalised in Gemelli Hospital in Rome. The good news, at the time that I write my Message (Thursday), is that the Pope's condition has been improving slightly over the past few days. Improving to the extent that he has been able to sit up and deal with some of the administrative work that has been accumulating. Thank you for remembering him in your prayers, and please continue to pray for him.

We are now about to experience again, seasonal change. March 1 marks the beginning of the season of Autumn for all who live in the Southern Hemisphere, and for those living in the Northern Hemisphere, it will be Spring. But we are soon to enter the new liturgical season of Lent from this Wednesday, Ash Wednesday (March 5), and since we are on the verge of beginning this new liturgical season, I thought it appropriate to offer a reminder to Parishioners about this Lenten season.

Firstly, Lent is a solemn penitential season of prayer, self-denial and helping others. It is a season to repent and to prepare one's soul for the marvellous and glorious celebration of Christ's conquering of sin and death with his Resurrection on Easter Sunday. The seasonal colour for Lent, as reflected in the priest's vestments, is violet. Lent runs for a total of forty-seven, 40 days from Ash Wednesday to Palm Sunday, and then continues for the remaining seven days of Holy Week and ending on Holy Saturday. Of course, seasonal colours and duration is just general knowledge. You will also notice that the Gospel Acclamation's introduction with 'Alleluia, Alleluia!' and the praying of the Gloria prayer will cease in Masses celebrated during Lent. The second aspects of Lent that I want to share with you, is what you need to know in order to deepen your own personal celebration of Lent, and the liturgical planning that is specific to our Parish of Banyo Nundah.

Both Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of **fast and abstinence**. So what do the Church laws of fasting and abstinence mean, and to whom do they apply?

The law of fasting binds all those who have completed their eighteenth year, until the beginning of their sixtieth year (Code of Canon Law 97, 1251-1252). Fasting involves a person purposefully reducing the size of their food intake, and also, perhaps, forgoing a meal (e.g. lunch). Fasting emphasises making a personal sacrifice (penance) by an individual for the sake of the Kingdom.

The law of abstinence binds all those who have completed their fourteenth year (Code of Canon Law 97, 1251-1252), and it endures throughout their lives. They are required to abstain from eating meat on Fridays during Lent, unless during Lent, a solemnity should fall on a Friday. I can inform you that there are no solemnity feasts falling on a Friday during Lent in 2025, so every Friday in Lent is a day of abstinence.

Caritas Australia (CA) once again, with the cooperation of the Church will conduct it's *Project Compassion* program during Lent. Their resources (weekly tithing envelopes or collection boxes) were placed in our Parish churches last weekend and are now available for you to take home. *Project Compassion* offers a family or an individual the opportunity to assist the poor and needy in the world (particularly those living in third-world areas) cope with life's challenges.



Your monetary contributions (big or small) are always deeply appreciated by CA, and their organisation will forward your contributions to needy persons. Participating in **Project Compassion** represents, yet another alternative way, of offering up to the Lord, small acts of penance.

The Parish has recently advertised for interested Parishioners who would like to participate in the annual Lenten Daily Reflection and Prayer program to contact the Parish Office to reserve their copy of the program. We had four Parishioners order the program booklets; these have arrived and are now available for collection. This year's program is titled, *Start Anew in Christ*. The Lenten Prayer program, like the Advent Prayer program, enable the participants to deepen their spiritual and personal journeys towards Easter and Christmas respectively. Anyone who might like to also join

the Lenten Prayer Program, from this point onwards, will have to arrange their own procurement of the daily reflection booklet. Use the QR code that is provided here to order and pay for your booklet.




I mentioned earlier that Lent is a penitential season, and the Sacrament of Penance, is highly valued by the Church as a means to prepare our souls for the Easter event. In this respect, then, I would remind all Parishioners that I hear individual confessions by people each Saturday afternoon (3:45pm - 4:45pm) in the Holy Trinity Church, Banyo, except on Holy Saturday. In addition, I will be offering two Second Rite of Reconciliation services (one per Mass Centre) during Lent; both will commence at 7:00pm. The first of these will be in the Nundah Church on Wednesday, 26 March; the second will be in the Banyo Church on Friday, 28 March. The Second Rite of Reconciliation is a valid alternative to the First Rite which I offer each Saturday afternoon. The Second Rite is celebrated in a communal setting, in a liturgy that includes hymns, scripture readings, a homily, an examination of conscience, and then individual confession of sins. The Parishioner attendance at the eight Second Rite liturgies that I have celebrated in my 27 months in this Parish have been fairly static.

Lay-led weekly Stations of the Cross liturgies will be conducted in the Banyo Church on Wednesday evening during Lent. These liturgies will commence from this Wednesday at 6:30pm. All are most welcome. Unfortunately, due to both my personal time constraints and the vacant Corpus Christi Church Sacristan volunteer situation, the Parish is unable to offer weekly Stations of the Cross in the Nundah Church. I would ask all who would favour attending Nundah Stations of the Cross to consider attending the Banyo Stations. I will lead the annual 10:00am Good Friday Stations of the Cross (18 April) in the Banyo Church.

The last, and perhaps most important reminder concerns the Easter Triduum. The Triduum (3 Days) begins with the 7:00pm Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper in the Banyo Church on Thursday 17 April. The Triduum continues on Good Friday (18 April) in the Nundah Church with the 3:00pm Celebration of the Passion of the Lord. The Triduum concludes with the 7:00pm Solemn Easter Vigil on Saturday, 19 April, again in the Nundah Church. Our Parish's three RCIA Candidates will be received into the Church during the Easter Vigil — please remember them in your prayers.

Let's try and make our 2025 Lenten journeys a special one, given that this is the Jubilee Year for the Pilgrims of Hope. God bless you all!
